Button cost was in the amount of \$529.00, button money turned to date is in the amount of \$1,694.00.

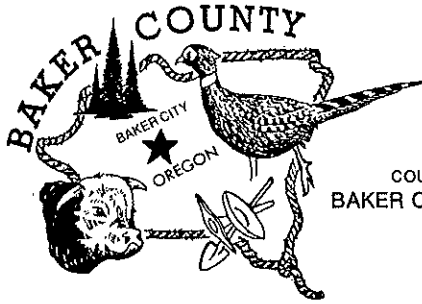
Overall, the Fair seems to have gone pretty well.
