Subject: 2014 Region Rally @ the Baker County Fairgrounds

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We've done it both ways. A basic rally fee and then separate per night parking. Or it can be one fee. If we are at an RV resort, they often want to collect the per night parking fee and have each rig registered in their office. That's what happened at our last Region Rally.

Our basic rally fee per person, will be calculated on the price per plate of each meal, entertainment divided among the attendees, and sometimes, tours are calculated in the basic fee depending on whether we offer them as part of the rally or as a do it on your own where we could have a sign-up at the rally or on the registration form, so we would make arrangements for a certain number at a certain time. In your case, if you wanted to give us a price for renting the building that we will occupy (we would divide that by the number of folks we expect to attend).

Perhaps, each thing could be a separate line item, so we could do the division and get a per person fee. Some members on my planning team are advocating for a separate weekend rate, since many of the Oregon folks are still working and would not be there until Friday. We've paid as little as \$18 per night for full service hook-ups (water, electric and sewer). Sometimes, we are given a special group rate.

If the numbers you plan to give us include the catering, perhaps we should have a per plate price. If we were to do a potluck meal, we might need the kitchen for 1 day and daily, we would want to have a coffee pot and hot water pot available so folks can help themselves as needed. We would bring the coffee, creamer, sugar and tea.

Does that give you some ideas? Keep asking and I will try to answer. =-) Carol
